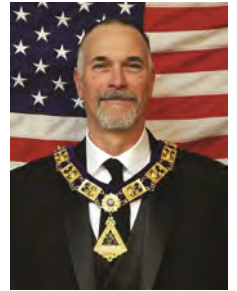

This month as part of our giving back initiative ... the Antlers donated many items to the Veteran's from the Lyon's Hospital. So proud of this group.

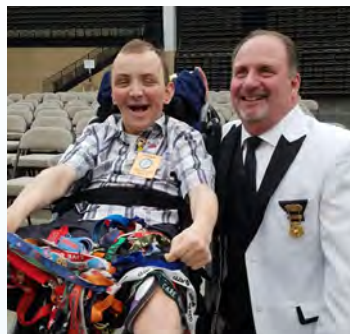
Our clothing drive is still going strong and we appreciate any and all donations. Thanks to all who have donated.
