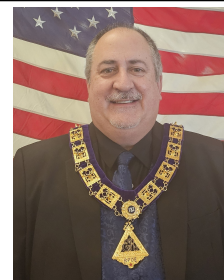

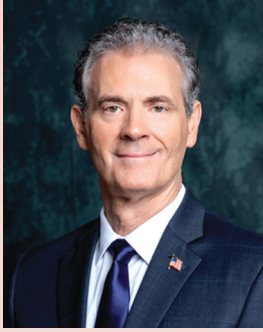

ENF Grants, Programs Strengthen Our Communities



The most important program in our Order is the Elks National Foundation. The support we provide makes the Foundation’s work possible. The goal we established for the 2024–2025 fraternal year is \$5.00 per Member.

This year the Foundation has allocated \$16.3 million for Lodge Community Service Grants. This grant program allows our Lodges to do more for your communities. I encourage all Lodges to seriously consider forming an ENF committee to educate themselves on the various grants to assist their communities.

Also, make use of the fundraising program through the ENF Fidelity Club. Any Member can sign up at elks.org to make the automatic recurring donations for as little as \$5 per month or \$15 per quarter. I encourage you to consider joining. I felt good when I joined and knew that it was an easy and efficient way to donate. This is once again a way for you to show your communities that “Elks Care — Elks Share.”

My theme “Elkdom’s Heart for America” focuses our attention on what we can do outside of the Lodge to help others. Another important program we must focus our attention on is Red Ribbon Week. This is our nation’s oldest and largest drug prevention program, held annually from October 23-31.

There are many ways to celebrate. Have your local elected officials issue a proclamation declaring Red Ribbon Week. Hold an event for them and give these students recognition certificates to administer to the schools. I am always amazed at the wisdom and knowledge that students can express. 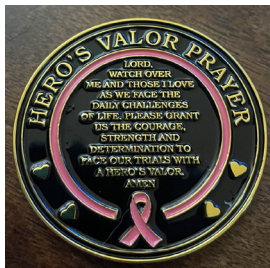
We have secured December 6th for our annual Wreath & Sip at Nestors, please be on the lookout for tickets for this great event!

How Common Is Breast Cancer?

Breast cancer is the most common cancer diagnosed among women in the U.S. Each year, about 30% of all newly diagnosed cancers in women are breast cancer.

In 2024, approximately 310,720 women will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer, 16% of which will be in women younger than 50 years of age.

Also, 56,500 women will be diagnosed with ductal carcinoma in situ (DCIS). About 66% of breast cancer cases are diagnosed at a localized stage — before cancer has spread outside of the breast — when treatments tend to work better. There are currently more than four million women with a history of breast cancer in the U.S. This includes women currently being treated and women who have finished treatment. Less than 1% of all breast cancers occur in men.
